***NURTURING GIFTEDNESS:
Using Brain Research at Home and at School***

in a session especially for **parents**

One outcome of the current research in the neurosciences has been the discovery of important information on how giftedness develops. We now know that higher levels of intellectual functioning are the result of a dynamic, interactive process between the genetic patterns inherited by the individual and the environmental opportunities they are given. It is that stimulation that nurtures the cognitive, affective, physical, and intuitive areas of the brain. With giftedness come unique characteristics and behaviors.

During this parent session, information will be provided to help you understand these characteristics and the possible needs and problems that may result from them. Strategies will be suggested that can take advantage of the brain research to support your family as you continue to nurture the giftedness in your children and youth.

Barbara Clark, Ed.D. is Professor Emeritus, California State University, Los Angeles and the author of the widely used text, *Growing up Gifted*, now in its seventh edition, copyright 2008. She is a past president of the World Council for Gifted and Talented Children, the National Association for Gifted Children, and the California Association for the Gifted. She is a recognized scholar and has presented major addresses and workshops throughout the United States and the world.
