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Want to use your knowledge of computers to complete **Community Service Hours**? Sign up for the TekEase Computer Support Program to get hands-on experience optimizing, debugging, and troubleshooting Macintosh and/or Windows based computer systems.

Here's how it works:

1. Sign up for the TekEase Program at your Career Center using a TekEase program application.
2. You will then be contacted and asked to attend a TekEase training workshop. Here you will combine your already existing knowledge of computers with some hands-on troubleshooting and optimization training from computer industry professionals.
3. With your new skills, you will be assigned to regular service at a local school that is in need of computer technology support.

What you get:

1. Community service hours needed for graduation.
2. Significant improvement in your computer technology expertise and know-how on both Mac and PC platforms.
3. High School students completing 100 or more hours receive the Presidential Volunteer Service Award. Middle School students completing 50 hours or more will also receive this award.

A sample service:

A high school technology student commits to weekly visits to the local elementary school to “trouble shoot and service” computer and technology needs defined by the principal or TekEase Lead Coordinator.
