page	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • /p/ <i>pig</i> OR <i>popcorn</i> card: only one spelling p • /a/ <i>acorn</i> OR <i>long a</i> card: not _ay because sound is not at the end of the word (or syllable); probably not a because sound is not at the end of an open syllable; could be a_e or ai but must look at the next sound • /j/ <i>jump</i> card; not dge because of long a, not j because no English word ends in j, not gi_ because it is the last sound, therefore, it is ge and the long a spelling is a_e

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daytime	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • /d/ <i>duck</i> OR <i>dinosaur</i> card: one spelling d • /a/ <i>acorn</i> OR <i>long a</i> card: _ay because sound at end of the syllable • /t/ <i>tiger</i> OR <i>timer</i> card: not _ed because not at end of an action root so it is t • /i/ <i>ice cream</i> OR <i>long i</i> card: not i because not at end of an open syllable; not y or ie because not last sound; probably not <i>igh</i> because it is not that common; i_e most common • /m/ <i>mouse</i> OR <i>monkey</i> card: one spelling m (written on the blank line OR space)
ginger	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • /j/ <i>jump</i> card: not _dge because it is the first sound; the second sound is /i/, so gi is a good choice • /i/ <i>igloo</i> OR <i>pig</i> card: one spelling i • /n/ <i>noodle</i> OR <i>nose</i> card: not kn_ because it is not the first sound, therefore n • /j/ <i>jump</i> card: not dge because sound is not preceded by a short vowel; the next sound is /er/, so not gi_; most common spelling of /er/ is er, so ge is best choice • /er/ <i>bird</i> card: er because of ge and most common
fudge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • /f/ <i>fish</i> OR <i>fan</i> card: one spelling f (if ph has been added to the card, it is not this because the word is not of Greek origin) • /u/ <i>umbrella</i> OR <i>tug</i> card: one spelling u • /j/ <i>jump</i> card: not gi_ because not at beginning of word or syllable; not j because no English word ends in j; following a short vowel the best choice is _dge
